<p><u>Recreating Famous Pieces of Art</u> Research a famous pointillism picture and recreate it. You could even use the 2 paint a picture pointillism tool on Purple Mash!</p>	<p><u>Playscript</u> Select a part of a story you enjoy and change it into a playscript. 🏆</p>	<p><u>Time tables Game</u> Create a game to help someone learn their times tables. This could be an active game or a board game. ★</p>
<p><u>Pointillism</u> Create your own pointillism image. You can use felt tip pens or even a hole punch. Remember, pointillism is using many small dots to create an image! ★</p>	<p><u>Art Review:</u> Choose a famous pointillism image and write a review of it. What does it make you think of? How does it make you feel? What do you think has influenced the artist to create this picture?</p>	<p><u>Fact Families (X and ÷)</u> Create fact families to show your understanding of the link between multiplication and division. E.g. $7 \times 5 = 35$ $5 \times 7 = 35$ $35 \div 7 = 5$ $35 \div 5 = 7$</p>
<p><u>George Seurat</u> Create a portrait of George Seurat using pointillism. You can choose what materials you want to use. 🏆 </p>	<p><u>Letter to MK Art Gallery</u> Write a letter to MK Art gallery asking them to display a piece of pointillism art work you have created. ★</p>	<p><u>Arty Measurement</u> Look at a piece of Pointillism art you like – measure the size of people and objects in the painting. 🏆</p>
<p><u>Light sources</u> Find examples of different light sources around your home – you could photograph them or draw pictures of them and label them.</p>	<p><u>Persuasive Letter</u> Write a letter to persuade someone to do something you would like them to do. 🏆</p>	<p><u>Timeline</u> Find out the dates of art work released by George Seurat and create a timeline of events. ★</p>
<p><u>Well-being</u> Create a poster about well-being and include how we can look after ourselves and other people.</p>	<p><u>Biography</u> Write a biography on George Seurat. You could research facts to help you in the library or online. ★</p>	<p><u>Arty-Maths</u> Write out a times table sequence you are learning using the Pointillism technique. Or explore multiplication circles – which shapes do the different times tables create?</p>
<p><u>3 Colour Challenge</u> Create a piece of artwork using the Pointillism technique and <u>only 3 colours</u>. 🏆</p>	<p><u>Poetry</u> Select a poem you enjoy and learn it – you could perform the poem for family or even record yourself saying the poem. Think about how to make it exciting for the audience.</p>	<p><u>How long did it take?</u> One Pointillism painting took 2 hours and 43 minutes to create, another took 3 hours and 54 minutes. How much longer did the second one take? 🏆</p>
