<p>Make a habitat </p> <p>Can you create a habitat for a jungle animal? You could use recycled materials - anything you find at home. You can bring this in to show us or you can take a photo and tell us all about it.</p>	<p><u>Spelling</u></p> <p>Children will receive spellings each week. These should be practised using the Look, Cover, Write and Check strategy. The children should then write sentences to apply these spellings.</p>	<p><u>Maths Home Learning</u></p> <p>Children will be set a Maths task online every week. This will be linked to their in-class learning. Paper copies can be available at request.</p>
<p>Design a Dinner</p> <p>Can you design a delicious dinner for a rainforest animal? Think about what they need to eat to be healthy and what different treats they might like.</p>	<p><u>Reading</u></p> <p>Children should be reading for ten minutes each night. Please initial in their planner so that we can reward them with a star. Children are encouraged to change their own books but if this is not happening, we are happy to remind them.</p>	<p>Money</p> <p>What coins can you find in your house? Can you count them to work out the total and draw them in your book?</p>
<p>Fact Finding </p> <p>Can you find out five interesting facts about the Amazon jungle? You could use books from the library or the internet to help you.</p>	<p>Write a story </p> <p>You can choose to retell a familiar story that is set in a jungle or write your own. Make sure you include lots of interesting adjectives and the correct punctuation.</p>	<p>A zoo timetable </p> <p>Can you create a timetable for the shows at the zoo? You could write the time in numbers or words or even draw the clock. Remember to include lots of exciting shows like the exotic bird show.</p>
<p>Make a Mask</p> <p>Can you make an exciting mask? This could be of an animal or a made up creature linked to the jungle.</p>	<p>Let's go to the zoo!</p> <p>Can you write a letter to Mrs Good persuading her that we should be allowed to visit a jungle?</p>	<p>Estimating</p> <p>Can you estimate the length of different jungle animals? You could order the different animals using standard or non-standard measures. Is there a way that you could check your estimations?</p>
<p>Learn a jungle song</p> <p>Can you learn a jungle song to perform?
