<p>Land Ahoy! Pretend you are a sailor sailing the seven seas. Design and make the island that you come across. Can you label your design with the materials you would use to create it?</p> 	<p>Spelling Children will receive spellings each week. These should be practised using the Look, Cover, Write and Check strategy. The children should then write sentences to apply these spellings.</p>	<p>Hiding the Gems A sailor has 20 gems. He wants to share them between 3 treasure chests to hide them. How many different ways can the pirate hide the 20 gems in the 3 treasure chests? You can draw the gems or write the number sentences.</p>
<p>The Sailors Lunch Sailing a boat all day is hard work! Can you make the sailor a packed lunch that will give him energy? What delicious food will you include? Make sure it has some healthy choices too. You could draw his packed lunch or you could make it and take pictures.</p> 	<p>Reading Children should be reading for ten minutes each night. Please initial in their planner so that we can reward them with a star. Children are encouraged to change their own books but if this isn't happening we are happy to remind them.</p>	<p>Treasure Challenge Pretend you are a pirate and you find lots of coins in a treasure chest for your money bag. You are only allowed to choose 5 coins but they must all be different. How many combinations of coins could you choose and how much money would be in your money bag? Draw out the coins.</p>
<p>Fact Finding Can you find out about an island in a different continent? Find 5 facts about this island including the animals that live there. Can you include a picture or a description of where this island is?</p> 	<p>Secret Island Finding a secret island would be a very exciting thing for a sailor. Can you write a description of how your sailor might feel and what they might find on your secret island?</p>	<p>Design a Ship Design a ship using shapes that you know. Can you label these shapes? You can use pencils or can you challenge yourself to use the computer?</p> 
<p>X Marks the Spot A treasure map is the most important thing that a pirate must remember when he sets sail to look for treasure. Design a treasure map to show someone where you would hide the treasure in your home. Choose one room in your house to draw a map of and remember, X marks the spot!</p>	<p>A Letter in a Bottle A letter in a bottle was commonly used to tell people what it was like to be a sailor out at sea or to ask for help if you were stuck at sea. Can you write a letter for a bottle to tell your teacher what you have done at the weekend or what you have enjoyed doing this term?</p> 	<p>Worded Problems If there are 5 coconuts on each tree and there are 10 trees on the island, how many coconuts would there be altogether? Can you write out your own worded problems for a friend to answer? Make sure you work out the answer and hide it so they can't cheat.</p>
<p>Parrots on a Ship There are 12 parrots and 3 ships. There must be a different amount of parrots on each ship.
